Uncovering the Past: An Archaeological Tour

Join a professional guide to explore several archaeological sites and discover how the information preserved underground can teach us about the daily life of people living in this region over the last 400 years.

Learning from the Landscape: A Botanical History Tour

Explore 400 years of history through Strawbery Banke's gardens and landscapes. Tours can be customized to the interest of the group and often include subjects such as medicinal plant history, culinary plants and historic recipes and ornamental flower traditions (offered May – Oct).

Tale of Two Marys: 19th-century Women's History

Compare and contrast the stories of two windowed women living in the same neighborhood 200 years ago. Discover how quality of life was influenced by gender, economic status and sometimes, pure grit.

Recollections of Home: The Early 20th-century Through Oral Histories
