
Setting Up Shop: Colonization and the Early American **Economy**

A perfect introduction to colonization, this program uses games, discussion and critical thinking to explore life in Colonial America. Topics include the relationship between indigenous people and English colonizers, the use of natural resources available in America and the ins and outs of the colonial economy.
