Grim most recently served as Vice President of Guest Experiences for the Thomas Jefferson Foundation, a private nonprofit that owns and operates Monticello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.




Grim has 23 years of experience working in leadership positions at nationally important historic sites, history organizations, and in the Office of the Curator at the Supreme Court of the United States. She spent the last 16 years at Monticello

serving as Hunter J. Smith Director of Education & Visitor Programs and Manager of Interpretive Programs prior to joining Monticello's executive team in 2021. She has a Bachelor of Arts degree, magna cum laude, from The College of William and Mary, and a Master's degree in history museum studies from The Cooperstown Graduate Program.

She takes over on March 6, succeeding Lawrence J. Yerdon, who is retiring after 18 years in the position.

Dr. Geoffrey E. Clark, a longtime friend and supporter of Strawbery Banke, died on Sunday, January 8, 2023, at his family's retreat on Argo Point in York, ME, with his family by his side. In addition to his life's work as a physician and medical entrepreneur, he and his wife, Martha Fuller Clark, Strawbery Banke Trustee, actively supported historic preservation and a bustling creative community. He invested both his time and treasure in a variety of non-profit organizations, including Strawbery Banke Museum, The Music Hall, Planned Parenthood of Northern New England, Families First, New Hampshire Public Radio, and Sustainable Harvest International.



Gibson B. "Mike" Kennedy, Jr., Strawbery Banke Museum Trustee, friend, and supporter, died peacefully on January 5, 2023, surrounded by his loving family. In addition to Strawbery Banke, Mike was active in numerous Portsmouth organizations, was a former Commissioner of the Portsmouth Housing Authority, and was a former Board member for Portsmouth Historical Society / Discover Portsmouth.



Joanne Lamprey, friend and supporter of Strawbery Banke, died peacefully on January 2, 2023, at Webster at Rye surrounded by loved ones. Joanne devoted her life to helping others and the greater good of her community. She supported numerous organizations, including The Music Hall, the New Hampshire SPCA, Families First, and Friends Forever International.

Douglas Wheeler, Strawbery Banke National Council member and supporter, died on December 22, 2022. He had a deep love of history and was professor emeritus of history at UNH, serving from 1965 until his retirement in 2002.
